First time attendees, Karin Bernauer and Susan Dallyn, enjoyed the busy lunch events.






What do I take when I Travel?

BEWARE SOPHISTICATED PHONE SCAM

HELLO GRANNY?! I need your help!

VPD ALERT

In the first week of August this year, a gentleman in his 70s living in metro Vancouver was scammed \$90,000 over the course of 4 phone calls and several days in which he made three bank withdrawals to rescue his pleading "grandson needing bail to get out of jail right now". The scammers work as a pair, with one acting as the distraught grandson and the other as a police officer or doctor to verify the "grandson's" claim of distress. They intimidate the victim by saying there is a GAG order in place so that the grandparent must not tell anyone, even the bank teller, why


the money is being withdrawn or the grandson will be jailed immediately.

This Grandparent Scam is prevalent in Vancouver right now, with the average amount of money taken from a victim between \$8000 and \$15000 each week. Due to embarrassment, few victims are reporting this scam. Thus the Vancouver Police Department are reaching out to Blockwatch members with a new Coffee with a Cop series, featuring conversations with VPD police officers/detectives on various topics. Check with your local Blockwatch Captain for more details.
